



Wakasa Railway

The Wakasa Line is operated from Koge Station to Wakasa Station by the Wakasa Railway. In 2008, facilities along the line (Wakasa, Tanpi, Hatto, Abe, Hayabusa, and Inaba Funaoka Station buildings, bridges, turntables, etc.) were registered as national tangible cultural properties, the first time in Japan.

All aboard!

Kase

This is the first station for the Wakasa Railway, but most trains continue onto the JR line to Tottori Station.

Yazurko Mae

Located near Yazu High School, this station is bustling with many students in the morning and evening.

Inaba
Funaoka

Located near a former cow-breeding center, there is a scale for weighing cows on the platform.

Hayab

The "mecca" of the **Hayabusa** motorcycle! Many riders make a "pilgrimage" here on weekends.

Abe

The location for the movie, "Otoko wa Tsurai yo" ("It's Tough Being a Man"), there is a scarecrow in the likeness of actor Tora-san on the platform.

Hatto

The disused freight platform was repurposed and now displays a caboose known as "WAKU 35597".

Tokun

The newest station on the line, built in 2002. It is right in the middle of countryside fields.

lamp

Rails from Carnegie Steel, king of steel in America, are used for the platform roof.
